

## Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI Training)

### A. How to add/change your affiliated institution or transfer completions

If you already created a CITI account, you will need to link your account with the Medical College of Wisconsin. Please follow instructions [here](#).

### B. How to register, create my CITI Program account, and select my Learning Group Modules?

MCW requires individuals involved in the design, conduct or review of human subject research to have current Human Subject Research Protections training. MCW utilizes the CITI Program to provide Human Subject Research Protections training for biomedical researchers, social/behavioral researchers and research reviewers.

Go to [www.citiprogram.org](http://www.citiprogram.org) and click on the "Register" button located on the right hand side of the page.

- o Step 1: enter "Medical College of Wisconsin" as your organization and click on "Continue"
- o Step 2: enter your first and last name and email address and click on "Continue". Please list the email address in your eBridge account as the primary email in CITI.

- o Select the Learner Group that most closely matches your research and your role in research; choose from Learner Groups 1 -6, or 8 and click on "Next".

C. What modules must I complete?

The required modules depend on the type of research and your role in that research. Please make sure to review the descriptions for each module to see if they relate to your specific project. The most common modules for Emergency Medicine Research are:

- Social/Behavioral Research involves observational and survey research, work with population and/or epidemiological studies. This type of research does not involve any drugs or devices (investigational or marketed).
- Biomedical Research involves any type of clinical research studies, including those that involve investigational drugs and/or devices.
