Sponsors, Clinical Research Organizations, and others:

As you likely are aware, institutions that review federally-funded research must comply with the revised Common Rule effective January 21, 2019. Additionally, the Medical College of Wisconsin

(MCW) has opted to transition all ongoing research to comply with the revised Common Rule, which includes updating the consent forms for all ongoing projects to reflect the revised requirements for consent.

The transition to the consent form must occur at the time of the next submission for each project, and exceptions to this rule will not be granted. A submission, therefore, will not be reviewed unless

the consent form has been updated to reflect the revised Common Rule effective January 21, 2019.
